1. November 2011 meeting notes accepted and closed.
2. Keith Wolsiefer & Linda Bryer have been accepted by the selectmen for three year terms. They need to see the Town Clerk & get sworn in.
3. Jeff Littleton <http://moosewoodecological.com> spoke to the Commission & Planning Board member M Pinello about what a Natural Resource Inventory is and how it can help the town with planning for development. It can be done in multiple phases. Phase one compiles existing published resources such as Wildlife Action Plan, Water Resource & Groundwater Info, Ag Resources and Forest Type Resource Maps. These are put together as multiple overlays. Phase 2 ground truths the habitat and wildlife species found in Phase 1. This can be done on a town wide or property basis. Asked Jeff for a proposal for Campbell Pond Property (Phase 1 & Phase 2).
4. Campbell Pond still in Selectmen's court. Need to bring up formalizing passive walking, parking and timber harvest easement. Selectmen to contact landowners.
5. CIP process dropped Commission's request for \$25, 000 to initiate potential Open Space Plan acquisitions.
