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11	CTO: Chair Murdough called the meeting to order at 9:15 A.M.
12 13 14	Chair Murdough explained that the purpose of this site visit is to walk and view the property that is the subject of a seven-lot subdivision that is currently before the Board. He recognized Mr. Lefebrve, who is representing the applicant, and welcomed him to explain and describe the proposal.
15 16 17 18 19 20	Mr. Lefebrve began by opening the plan sheets and oriented everyone to their current location relative to the remainder of the parcel. He suggested that to begin, they should walk down to Route 202 so that he could point out the location of the three proposed driveways. While this was done, Mr. Lefebrve answered questions about the grade of the driveways. In particular, he described the NH DOT permit requirements, and noted that at no point would water runoff from the driveways be allowed to enter the state road. In addition, all drainage from the site would be treated on-site.
21 22 23 24	Mr. Lefebrve then led the group onto the parcel and walked to each of the seven proposed house sites, pointing out the wetlands, and describing the mitigation measures that will be implemented to minimize any impacts from the development- all of which would be designed and implemented according to the NH DES requirements.
25 26	Having walked the entirety of the site, and there being no further questions, Chair Murdough thanked Mr. Lefebrve for being available and adjourned the meeting at 10:30 A.M.
