The Chair expressed concern that the terms of most Board Members had expired without (a) their reappointment and (b) no clear sense of when they were appointed, which would determine the date on which their terms had expired. Several members suggested they had no lawful authority to act. Mr. Holmes had apparently advised the Chair that his absence was due at least in part to the Board of Selectmen's failure to formally reappoint him.
24 25 26 27	The Administrative Assistant advised the Board that the traditional American practice is that, when a public official's term expires without the election or appointment of a successor, the official remains in office and may exercise its full authority until properly reappointed or replaced. ¹ After further discussion, the Chair asked the Board to
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¹ The Administrative Assistant has subsequently learned that under RSA 49-C: 20, an appointed official's term continues until a successor is appointed, and while local land use board members' terms are limited to three years, this statute states that if a successor has yet to be appointed and qualified at the end of the appointed member's term, the member may remain in office until such time.
